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THE MEANING AND SIGNIFICANCE OF EID UL-AD'HA

Eid ul-Ad'ha, also known as the Festival of Sacrifice, is one of the most important religious celebrations in Islam.

The occasion commemorates the willingness of Prophet Ibrahim (AS) to sacrifice his son, Ismail, as an act of obedience to **Allah (SWT)**. As Muslims around the world come together to observe Eid ul-Ad'ha.

This event symbolises Prophet Ibrahim's (AS) absolute devotion and trust in **Allah (SWT)**. It serves as a profound lesson about the significance of surrendering to the will of **Allah (SWT)**, even in the face of great challenges and sacrifices.

Muslims offer sacrifices of permissible animals, such as goats, sheep, or cows, as a symbolic gesture of their willingness to submit to **Allah's (SWT)** commands.

The meat from these sacrifices is divided into 3 parts: one for personal consumption, one for relatives and friends, and one for the less fortunate, ensuring that the spirit of generosity and sharing is maintained.

If you to choose to not divide your sacrifice into 3, then this is also allowed, but it is not as beneficial.

The celebration of Eid ul-Ad'ha serves as a reminder of the enduring legacy of Prophet Ibrahim (AS) and the enduring lessons of faith and devotion in Islam.

According to the narrative, Prophet Ibrahim (AS) demonstrated immense faith and obedience to **Allah (SWT)** command.

As the story goes, **Allah (SWT)** tested Prophet Ibrahim (AS) by asking him to sacrifice his beloved son, Ismail. Prophet Ibrahim (AS), despite his deep love for his son, was willing to carry out the command as a testament to his submission to **Allah (SWT)**.

However, as Prophet Ibrahim (AS) prepared to fulfill the sacrifice, **Allah (SWT)**, pleased by his unwavering faith, intervened and provided a ram as a substitute sacrifice instead.



We called to him, "O Abraham, You have fulfilled the vision." Indeed, We thus reward the doers of good. Indeed, this was the clear trial. (37:104-6)

Tashreeq

IT IS WAJIB TO RECITE ONCE AFTER EVERY FARDH PRAYER FROM THE FAJR OF 9TH DHUL HIJJAH UNTIL THE ASR OF 13TH DHUL HIJJAH. MEN SHOULD RECITE IT AUDIBLY IN A MODERATELY LOUD VOICE, AND WOMEN SHOULD RECITE IT IN A SOFT VOICE.

MAKE YOUR NIYYAH (INTENTION) BEFORE YOU START.

EXAMPLE: 'I INTEND TO PRAY TWO RAKA'AH OF THE EID PRAYER FOR ALLAH , WHICH INCLUDES 6 EXTRA WAJIB TAKBEERS, FACING THE KAABAH AND BEHIND THE IMAM'.

THE FIRST RAK'AH

- 1. Raise your hands to your earlobes and say Allahu Akbar.
- 2. Recite your opening supplication: Subhaanak-Allahumma wa bihamdika, wa tabaarak-asmuka, wa ta-'aala jadduka, wa la ilaaha illa ghayruk.
- 3. Now comes the main thing that differentiates the Eid prayer from other prayers! The Imam will now recite 3 takbeers to start the prayer. For each takbeer, raise your hands up to your ears and then let them fall to your sides.
- 4. Now that the takbeers are over, place your hands on the navel, as you would normally do while praying. Imam will then recite Surah al-Fatihah followed by another surah.
- 5. The rest of the rak'ah will be prayed as normal.

THE SECOND RAK'AH

- 1. The Imam will recite Surah al-Fatihah and another surah.
- After this, the Imam will recite 3 takbeers again.
 Remember, for each takbeer, raise your hands to your ears and let them fall to your side. When the takbeers are over, go down into a bowing position (ruku).
- 3. The rest of the rak'ah will be prayed as normal.
